Rounds 1 and 2 of the All Star Series will once again be a part of Daytona Bike Week. On March 4th Oglethorpe Speedway Park will kick off the series in Savannah, GA on the ultra smooth half mile. Then following an amateur day on March 5th, the All Star Series will roll into Volusia Speedway Park in Barberville, FL on March 6th for round 2 on the half mile.

Round 3 of the series will return to Paul Covert's Crooked Creek Speedway in Little Rock, AR. Paul has once again re-worked his short track to make it smoother and faster. Can Chris Carr repeat his win here for 2011?

On June 4th the All Star Series will travel to Wilmot Raceway in Wilmot, WI to race the half mile. This will be the second race in a three race weekend for Expert, Pro and Amateur riders as the Dairyland Classic will start off the weekend on Friday June 3rd at the Sheboygan County Fairgrounds in Plymouth, WI. Then round 5 of the All Star Series will move on to the beautiful Angell Park Speedway half mile facility in Sun Prairie, WI.

Peoria Speedway in Peoria, IL will host round 6 of the series on June 17th on the short track, the first race in another two race weekend with round 7 returning to the world famous Peoria Motorcycle Club TT track in Peoria, IL on June 19th.

We will celebrate Independence Day on July 4th in Frederick, MD at the Al Wilcox Memorial at the 89th Annual Barbara Fritchie Classic on the limestone half mile.

The All Star Series will once again finish the season at the Sioux Valley Cycle Club short track in Sioux Falls, SD on September 23rd the day before the Minnesota Mile at Canterbury Park in Minneapolis, MN.

The AMA sanctioned All Star National Flat Track Series was formed in 2010 to take the place of the AMA Hot Shoe Series when it was discontinued. Our goal is to provide AMA Pro & Expert racers venues to race at during the off weekends and in conjunction with AMA Pro Racing Grand National Championship Flat Track Series. As well as bringing the sport of Flat Track Motorcycle Racing to new venues and potentially new fans across the US.
